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## **PREFACE**

The State of Nebraska held the Training, Exercise, & Planning Workshop (TEPW) on October, 22, 2014 in coordination with the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency and the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center. The purpose of the workshop was to coordinate efforts among state agencies, regional, and local representatives and to review the priority areas in the five-year training plan for Nebraska.

This Nebraska Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan includes a five-year calendar covering years 2015 through 2019 linked to the 31 core capabilities and Nebraska's priority areas. The workshop highlighted opportunities for collaboration and priority areas. The Nebraska Emergency Management Agency reviews and approves training and exercise events as identified in the Nebraska Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan.

# POINTS OF CONTACT (POCs)

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*For training & exercises contacts by organization, see Appendix D.*

## PURPOSE

The purpose of the Multi-year Training and Exercise Plan (TEP) is to document an organization's overall training and exercise program priorities for a specific multi-year time period. It is considered to be a living document that can be updated and refined annually. These priorities are linked to corresponding core capabilities, and, if applicable, a rationale based on existing strategic guidance, threat assessments, corrective actions from previous exercises, or other factors. This Multi-year TEP identifies the training and exercises that will help the organization build and sustain the core capabilities needed to address its training and exercise program priorities.

The Multi-year TEP should lay out a combination of progressively building exercises – along with the associated training requirements – that address the priorities identified in the Training and Exercise Planning Workshop (TEPW) that are in line with the state and regional Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) analysis. A progressive, multi-year exercise program enables organizations to participate in a series of exercises, with each successive exercise building upon the previous one until mastery is achieved. Further, by including training requirements in the planning process, organizations can address known gaps and priority areas prior to exercising capabilities.

A Multi-year TEP may also serve as a follow-on companion document to the State of Nebraska's Homeland Security Strategy, and can provide a roadmap for the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency to follow in accomplishing the priorities described therein.

Included in this Multi-year TEP is a training and exercise schedule, which provides a schedule of the proposed activities for the years 2015 through 2019.

# PROGRAM PRIORITIES

The State of Nebraska's Homeland Security Strategy sets the direction and framework to guide the state and communities to work together to make Nebraska a safer place. Participants were asked to complete a survey of their local strengths and gaps in preparation for the TEPW. Prior to the workshop, participants completed State Threat/ Hazard Identification & Risk Assessment and the State Preparedness Report where they identified statewide priority areas, capability targets, and gap areas. These priority areas help to guide local and state decisions on where to train and exercise.

## TEPW Survey

As part of the Training, Exercise, and Planning Workshop (TEPW), participants are asked to provide input on the core capabilities based on the year's After Action Reports, exercises, real-world events, and training efforts. Twenty-five individuals took the survey, representing 18 agencies:

1. East Central PET Region
2. North Central PET Region
3. Panhandle PET Region
4. South Central PET Region
5. Southwest PET Region
6. Tri-County PET Region
7. ESF 1: Transportation
8. ESF 4: Fire Suppression
9. ESF 5: Emergency Management
10. ESF 6: Mass Care, Housing, & Human Services
11. ESF 8: Public Health & Medical
12. ESF 10: Environmental Quality
13. ESF 11: Agriculture & Natural Resources
14. ESF 13: Public Safety & Security
15. ESF 15: Military Support
16. North Central Health Department
17. Nebraska Department of Insurance
18. Nebraska Department of Corrections

Respondents were asked to identify their top core capability strengths. The four top areas of strength were:

1. Operational Coordination
2. Planning
3. Operational Communication
4. Community Resilience

Respondents commented on why these core capabilities were strengths:

*These are the items we have spent the most time and funding on, and we have exercises these the most.*

*Planning is the one of the main core practices and baseline for all core capabilities actions.*

*In the [Region,] steps have been made to increase operational communications between the local law enforcement and the State law enforcement with the additional installations of State Radio System (SRS) Consolettes. This remains an ongoing project with the goal of having the ability to bring smaller counties onto the system as users in the future. There are still disparate systems that will continue to have problems with common communications; however, it is much more improved. Agencies are using high speed notification systems and the use of social media to disseminate information to the public in a quick fashion.*

The respondents were then asked about the core capabilities that needed improvement. Many of these areas were the same as the top strengths. The top four core capabilities needing improvement were:

1. Operational Communications
2. Operational Coordination
3. Community Resilience
4. Planning

Respondents indicated these were continued needs within their region or agency. The respondents commented:

*Community Resilience: In the past, we have done a significant amount of work at the county level in regards to planning, exercising and training and collaborative efforts that have advanced preparedness. However, we need to continually maintain these collaborative efforts in order to have informed and prepared communities in an animal disease event. Additionally, outreach and collaboration at the industry/commodity group level is important for consistent messaging and planning activities.*

*Community Resilience based on the very nature of Nebraska as most first responder organizations are volunteer. Operational Communications has been identified in disaster AARs, as has Operational Coordination at the local level*

*Planning is an ongoing practice and will always be a main core capability to engage at any and all levels. Planning will lead into the Threat and Hazard Identification planning meeting and workshops. The region is in planning discussions to work through the THIRA process and to complete the assessment over the next year. Operational Coordination is always a consideration as this always presents the need for training that support the ICS/EOC interface.*

*We need to start a list of resources that are in our region that we could call upon during a disaster.*

Likewise, respondents indicated that the core capabilities appearing in their training and exercise plans over the next five years. The four most frequent responses were:

1. Operational Coordination (13)
2. Operational Communications (9)

3. Community Resilience (8)
4. Environmental Health & Safety (7)

Next, respondents were asked to talk about general training and exercise needs in their area. Training requests included:

- Fatality Management with state-wide partners
- Mass Care training
- ICS position-specific training including CBRNE & Railcar training, online investigations for law enforcement, EOC Interface, and Hazmat Tech training
- Paraclete training for end-users
- Credentialing Training
- Agriculture & livestock movement training
- Mutual aid communications
- Foreign Animal Disease training course

Exercise requests included:

- Incident support team exercises
- Communications exercises, including State Radio System and Mutual Aid
- Livestock movement exercise (cross-border)
- Credentialing exercise between regions
- Exercise to test limited transportation across state

Participants noted the three areas for occurring most frequently for correction action items and improvement plans from After-Action Reports were:

1. Operational Communications (12)
2. Operational Coordination (11)
3. Planning (5)

Finally, respondents were asked to rank order previously funded projects, equipment, or plans that require training or exercising. The results can be seen in Table 1.

## **THIRA & State Preparedness Report Input**

Prior to the TEPW, attendees were able to opt-in to attend the Threat/Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) Workshop and the State Preparedness Report Workshop. These workshops were held concurrent to the TEPW to better identify priority areas and gaps that would need to be addressed in the five-year training and exercise calendars. After compiling the priority areas identified in the THIRA workshop and the gaps from the State Preparedness Report Workshop, it was determined that continued efforts should focus on:

1. Operational Communications
2. Operational Coordination
3. Public Information and Warning
4. Economic Recovery
5. Intelligence & Information Sharing
6. Critical Transportation
7. Threat & Hazard identification

Areas with medium-level priority, but exhibiting larger gaps in planning, exercise, or training were also examined. These areas included:

1. Physical Protective Measures
2. Community Resilience
3. Supply Chain Integrity & Security

## **Training, Exercise & Planning Workshop**

The Training, Exercise & Planning workshop was held on Thursday, October 22, 2014 in conjunction with the State Preparedness Report workshop and the THIRA Workshop. Participants identified training and exercise opportunities, linked opportunities to core capabilities, and discussed and identified opportunities for collaboration.

Prior to the workshop, participants submitted their five-year training and exercise calendars. Calendars were compiled into a statewide multi-year training and exercise calendar. Participants tied the training and exercises to the core capabilities during the workshop and discussed areas in which they would like additional or continued training opportunities based on the THIRA and State Preparedness Report input.

State agencies and regions were asked to discuss how to incorporate priority areas or where the state priority areas were already being incorporated in the five-year training and exercise calendar. Attendees were invited to respond to the priority and gap areas and discuss areas of focus. Notes from this discussion are included below.

## **Operational Communications**

Operational Communications is an area of high priority throughout the state that several agencies and regions have included in their existing plans. Low scores were reported in relationship to the THIRA scenarios provided. North Central Nebraska has created coordinated 9-1-1 systems to address operational communication gaps. Previously the North Central area (Region 24) has done some table top exercises related to operational communications. A planned exercise next year will test mobile power and mobile communications across jurisdictions. Paraclete training is planned in targeted areas of the state; this year, technician-level training will be provided. The South Central region has a full scale exercise scheduled next year; one area of focus for the South Central PET Region is the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network and the State Radio System integration. Nebraska National Guard and NEMA plan on a COOP exercise in September 2015 that will include operational communications testing. Tri-County PET Region will have a full scale exercise next year that will test use of secure common use channels. NEMA plans this year include a communication technician course, communication leader course and a Mock Communication exercise.

## **Operational Coordination**

Specific training is needed in engaging stakeholders and determining objectives for operational coordination. Engaging decision makers is seen as a challenge; particularly in training and exercises. Basic orientation of decision makers to emergency management is still a need. Participants noted that resource typing and tracking was a specific challenge. The Department of Agriculture is developing position-specific ICS and NIMS training at the federal level. Emergency management 101 will take place again in late January to accommodate attendance by newly elected officials. A county board member from a county in southeast Nebraska attended the last EM101 session in North Platte and now voices a better understanding of what the EM job is. This person is happy to visit with other elected officials to let them know about the value of the course. Contact Renee from Nemaha County for more information. Tri-County continues to offer ICS courses. Position specific classes are also scheduled in Tri-County (Logistics, planning, Incident Command). It is difficult to get everyone to have their pre-requisites so they can attend these courses. A priority for Tri-County is to train to create and prepare incident management teams.

## **Public Information and Warning**

There is interest in increased training about IPAWS and Common Alerting Protocol. South Central is working with private communication companies. They are also working with NEMA to bring IPAWS training to the area. Many areas hold regular tests of alert systems. Southeast holds an annual severe weather symposium and alert system training that includes storm spotters. They plan to include the ready campus initiative next year. One area of specific need is creating alert protocol that addresses culture and language changes across the state.

## **Economic Recovery**

Economic Recovery challenges occur specifically in the transition from short term to long-term recovery. Similar to other areas, it is important to share training and exercises with decision

makers and stakeholders such as departments of economic development, chambers of commerce, private sector entities, and volunteer organizations. Potential areas of improvement include: engaging trade organizations; baseline economic assessments in individual communities; case study seminars and table-top exercises; legislative advocacy; and promotion of the Nebraska Preparedness Partnership to engagement business and enhance ICS/EOC interface.

## **Intelligence & Information Sharing**

South Central uses online forum to share intelligence among affiliated agencies which could be a model for other communities. Each law enforcement entity could plan, train and exercise individually or with partners if they use this subscription service. This service could also be used for sharing among ESF partners.

## **Threat & Hazard Identification**

Participants recommended training for threat and hazard recognition via social media, pandemic, outbreaks, weather spotter training, ag disasters, food safety, crop safety, cow/cattle operator training, hazmat training for transportation. Attendees also suggested coordinating threat-specific training such as Ebola, tornado, active shooter, and cyber-attack.

## **Critical Transportation**

Federal Department of Energy has identified Department of Roads as responsible for fueling state resources. There is always a need to plan for portable fueling stations, generators, and access to military resources. A planning exercise would help to identify priority of fueling, particularly the integration of fuel supply plans into local emergency operations plans. A planning exercise should involve private partners to determine plans for public fuel disbursement. Once plan is in place, include all ESF's in a functional exercise with private entities.

## **Physical Protective Measures**

Most critical infrastructure/ key resources is not widely known; as such, planning recommendations include increased planning between emergency managers, NIAC, and CIKR representatives to pre-stage resources to aid in community response and recovery. Participants recommended providing instructions for law enforcement on their role related to the response and support for physical protective measures.

## **Supply Chain Integrity and Security**

Different types of supplies and supply lines can be disrupted; these representatives should be brought together to plan for a coordinated response to supply chain disruption. Additionally, training for companies on bringing suppliers online (e.g., information technology, COOP) would assist in increasing supply chain integrity and security.

## **Community Resilience**

Participants suggested that as a first step in community resilience planning, organizations should identify relevant personnel who need training and the relevant courses needed. Resources to

meet the training needs (such as the American Red Cross, Citizen Corps, etc.) will assist in meeting areas of need. Finally, the Red Cross and Medical Reserve Corps courses should be added to the five-year training and exercise calendar.

## **METHODOLOGY AND TRACKING**

Training and exercise events are chosen by each representative agency or region. The events are approved by the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) where necessary and recorded according to HSEEP guidelines. After Action Reports or hot-washes are completed after each training, exercise, or real world event to evaluate effectiveness, lessons learned, strengths, and/or corrective action times.

## **MULTI-YEAR TRAINING AND EXERCISE SCHEDULE**

The following five-year calendar is provided to detail the training and exercise events that are planned for the years 2015 – 2019 for each region and state agency. Some agencies, such as the Department of Insurance, serve in a resource role and do not schedule events on the MyTEP calendar. The four state core capability priority areas of Operational Coordination, Operational Communications, Planning, and Community Resilience are color coded as noted.

Once calendar items are approved by their representative agency and NEMA, they may be shared at the state homeland planning website and calendar at <http://homelandplanning.nebraska.edu/>. The purpose of this website is to increase awareness and collaboration statewide projects, council meetings, training events, and exercises.
